# Suggestion for the Balloon Release

IRIS parents would like to make the following suggestions to help you with the balloon release.

# If you would like to have your balloon found Consider:

- Blowing up your own balloons with a small tank that you get from Wal-Mart or Target. (They will do about 30 balloons).
- 2. Do not blow the balloons up to full capacity. Filling them about ¾ of the way has the best results. This is because they do not go up as high thus preventing them from freezing and then shattering.
- 3. If you have balloons blown up in a store do not have the coating put on the inside.
- 4. Put a short string on the balloon. This will help to prevent tangling with other balloons before the release and helps prevent the balloon from getting caught in trees, power lines etc.
- 5. You may want to consider putting 2 very short ribbons on the balloon. Consider making the ribbon biodegradable.
- 6. Attach a lightweight tag to the string. Regular paper, covered with clear contact paper, that has a hole punched in it works great. If you make your own tag be sure to include your child's name, a message, where the balloon was released from, and a way for the person who finds the balloon to contact you. If you

do not want them to contact you directly, feel free to use the IRIS address and/or e-mail. Any mail that you receive will be forwarded to you. IRIS will provide tags and contact paper at the release.

## If you would like your balloon to be seen for a long distance consider:

- 1. Having brightly colored balloons. (Pastel colored balloons are hard to see.)
- 2. Use large balloons and blown up to capacity.
- 3. Rather then placing a ribbon or sting on the balloons, consider tying the balloon with a long piece of brightly colored crepe paper.
- 4. Release more than one balloon.

### Other Suggestions Include:

- 1. Consider putting wildflower seeds or birdseed inside of the balloon. (Stores will not want to do this because of the time it takes and the mess) If the balloon pops instead of being found, the seeds will be scattered a great distance.
- 2. Consider writing a note to your child and placing it inside of the balloon. Make sure it's very small.
- 3. Place all of your balloons in a large garbage bag to prevent tangling.
- 4. Keep your balloons in the bag until you are ready to release them.
- 5. Kiss the balloon before you release it.
- 6. Say a prayer or take a moment of silence as the balloons are released.
- 7. When the balloons are in the car, be sure to crack the windows several inches. The heat inside of the car will make the balloons expand and pop.
- 8. Balloons can be released in all weather conditions including rain.
- 9. Bring your camera and/or video camera. Balloon Release pictures make wonderful keepsakes.

# Requesting a "Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth" from the State of Minnesota

- 1. The "Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth" is only available through the state offices. You Can Not file for this certificate at your local county offices.
- Only the parents listed on the record of birth may request the certificate. This would be the mother and 2. father, if he is listed.
- To request the paperwork needed to file for the "Certificate of Birth Resulting in Stillbirth" go online to 3. the Minnesota Department of Health(MDH) website: www.health.state.mn.us and download both forms listed below:
  - A. Minnesota Application to File a Record and Request a Certificate For a Birth Resulting in Stillbirth
  - B. Minnesota Birth Record Application Certified Birth Certificate

- 4. If your child died over one year ago, you will need to have him/her added to a stillbirth database. This is done by completing; the "MN Application to File A Record and Request a Certificate for a Birth Resulting in Stillbirth" form.
  - A. Your signature on this form must be Notarized. This can be done in the IRIS office at no charge (after 9/2005) or by any Notary Public fees may apply.
  - B. You must include a copy of a Fetal Death Report. This is available at your local registrar's office, through your funeral home and/or through the hospital that you delivered in.

There is a \$9.00 fee for the Fetal Death Report

**OR** 

An <u>Authenticated Medical Record</u> This is a Medical Record showing:

- a. Date of the delivery
- b. Location of Delivery (must

be in MN)

- c. Child's gestational age (must be at least 20 gestational weeks at delivery)
- d. Have your medical record authenticated by asking your doctor or midwife to write a letter on business letterhead stating that the info is correct.
- 5. Submit all forms and documents along with \$40 fee to:

# Now that you have your child added to the database you can request a "Certificate for a Birth Resulting in Stillbirth" through the Minnesota Department of Health.
